**Acceptance: High season from 7 :00 to 21 :30 – Patrolled 24h/24**

**Separated by the Rock of Monaco, the Principality of Monaco has two harbors, Hercule and Fontvieille, ready to welcome you in the heart of the town, in a dream setting.**

**Upon your arrival a boat will show your mooring and you'll be offered any support you may need in anchoring.**

**Navigation**

Daytime access	Easy passageway in the harbour at NE.SW ; cruise speed limited to 3 nodes. Caution, works in progress in port Hercule.
Landmarks	'Tête de chien' at 1 M west from the town

Prevailing winds	Harbor sheltered from any wind, except the outer harbor, exposed to E wind (Hercule)

Located in the historic center of the capital of the Riviera, **Nice Harbor** is 15 minutes away from Nice

Cote d'Azur airport. With 500 berths (customers and transits), the harbor can accommodate boats all year round.

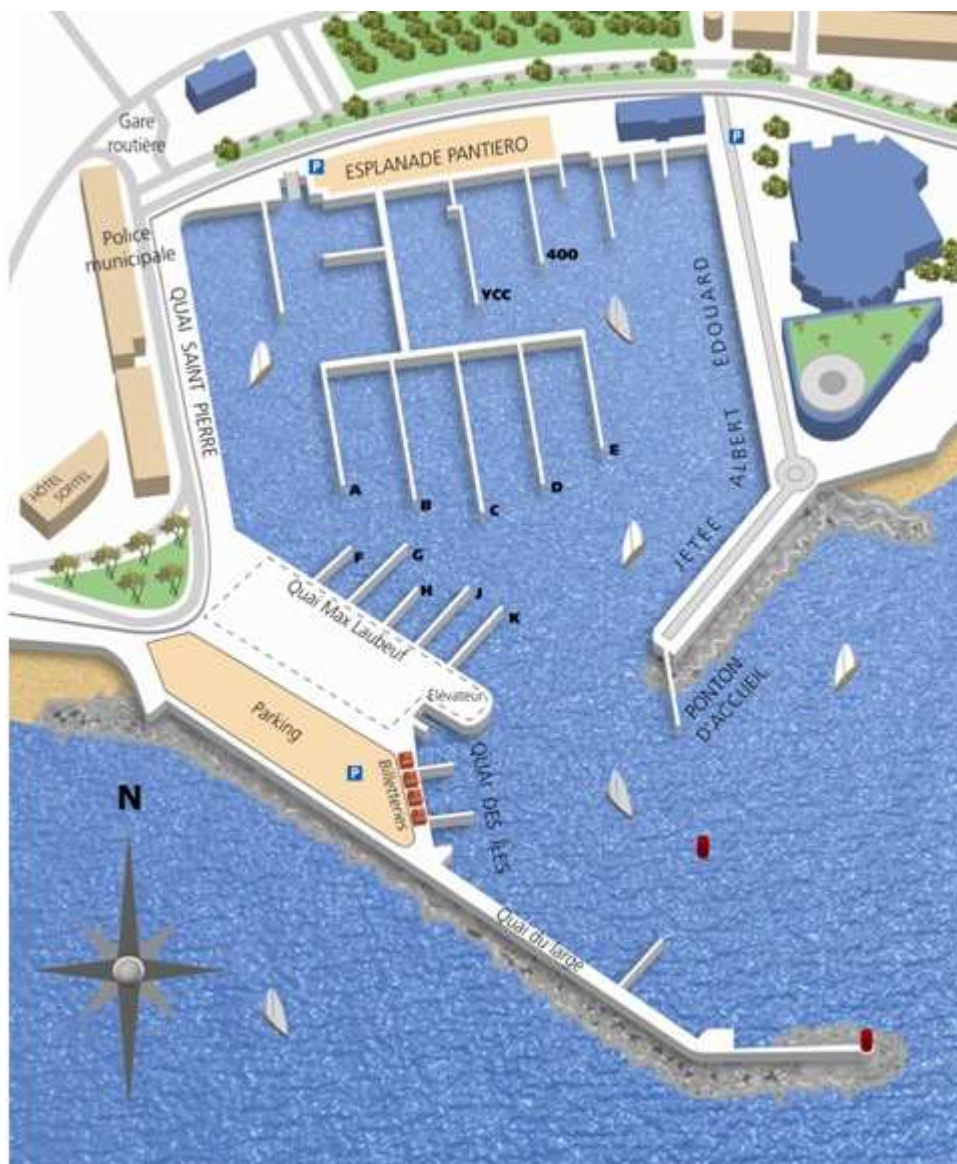
The draught is 7 meters deep and the maximum size of the boats is 140 meters.

There are shops and services in the vicinity.

### Navigation

Approach by day	The entry channel is difficult to see from the open sea; steer a course 012° towards the Mont Gros observatory to the light, sail along the pier head of the jetty leaving to starboard the groin of la Poudrière
Approach by night	Cap Ferrat light F.é.b.3s25M, then Nice light F.é.r.5s.
Light	Entry Light; the open sea jetty extr. : F.é.r.5s20M (43°41.4 N – 007°17.3 E) Starboard: Poudrière jetty F.é.v.4s, Platform, Ile de Beauté quay: F.2.é.v.6s; Ribotti jetty: F.3.é.v.12s Port side: Big Jetty Pier head F.2.é.r.6s; Extr. Infernet quay: F.3.é.r.12s

Located in the center of the city of the cinema, **Cannes Harbor** is 30 minutes away from Nice Cote d'Azur airport and 10 minutes away from Cannes-Mandelieu airport.

The harbor has 650 berths (customers and transits) which can accommodate boats all year round. The draught is 5 meters deep (a derogation is possible) and the maximum size of the boats is 145 meters.

A minute away from the Palais des Festivals and the Croisette, Cannes harbor is near all the shops and the services the city offers.

Navigation

<i>Approach by day</i>	Sail between the W pier and the Secant little tower which delimits the edge of the shallow waters; speed limit: 3 knots
<i>Approach by night</i>	Entry Light (43°32.7 N – 007°01.1 E): F.3é.r.2s8M Secant little tower: F.2é.v.6s4M, vis.276-178 (262)
<i>Light</i>	Lights on quays are prohibited

## PORT OF SAINT TROPEZ

### Navigation in the harbour

- **Speed**  
Maximum speed is 3 knots. Vigilance and courtesy are required due to heavy traffic. It's forbidden to enter the harbour or to work a skip without an engine .
- **Schedule**  
It's strongly advised to avoid maneuvering in the harbour from 11h00 to 12h30 and from 17h30 to 18h30.
- **Contact**  
DO NOT ENTER the harbour area prior to contacting the Harbour master's office on VHF channel 9.
- **Fire instructions**  
In the event of a fire spreading on board, the Captain, the owner, or the watch must immediately inform :  
The fire-brigade. Phone : 18  
The harbour master's office  
Phone : 04.94.56.68.70, VHF channel 9  
And attempt to extinguish the fire with any available means  
Rapidly remove all inflammable objects which could allow the fire to spread.
- **Quays**  
Do not leave on the quays any materials or vehicles, some special areas have been created for this purpose, use them !!!
- **Fuel**  
At the station of the green light. Open from 8h00 to 20h00 summer time. Delivery is possible.
- **Water**  
As the harbour's water supply is limited, wasting is not allowed. The authorities request that users equip their taps with automatic shut-off nozzles.
- **Wastes**  
Garbage pick-up is at 9 p.m. Please have your rubbish well wrapped and on the quay by this time. Quays must then be kept clear until the following morning. Plastic sacks are placed around the harbour for litter but are not suitable for items such as bottles, etc.
- **Pollution**  
The city of Saint-Tropez is making huge efforts to avoid pollution. All prohibitors will be persecuted.
- **Wasted oils**  
The harbour is equipped with two special tanks for engine oil disposal. Apply to the harbour's master office for use.

- **Emetteur CROSS Toulon - VHF**

Broadcasting from Port-Vendres to Saint-Raphaël  
Calling ID: Cross La garde or Cross med  
Channels: call on channel 16 then switch to channel 80

- **VHF coastal informations**

Broadcast at 7h45, 13h15, 19h45 local time. Special broadcast, if necessary at hours +3 minutes.

- **HF**

on 21,82 KHz à 6h50, 14h33 and 18h50 local time.

- **BMS**

Every 4 hours after 1h03.

- **Monaco radio center**

Lion area, Provence, Gêneswest and east Corse, North Baléares, west Sardaigne: channel 22 afeter calling on channel 16. Broadcast at à 9h30, 14h03, 18h15 local time.
